Increased play options at break times.	More children at KS1 had a focus during lunchtime play. Play leaders enjoyed trying different activities. Easier in better weather. Increasing staff confidence.	CPD in September on gymnastics was well received by all staff across both schools. KS1 staff member – worked well with supported lessons and followed on with own lesson using demonstrated approach.	Some classes haven't had any direct support.	Need to build in some observations/learning walks in PE next year to help identify where further support is needed.
Improved outdoor learning.	Orienteering schemes developed further to include activities aimed at younger children in KS1.	Some lessons still time consuming with set up.	Not all lessons in scheme taught. Need to continue developing the site with permanent markings to make delivery of outdoor education easier and less time consuming.





## **Bildeston Primary - Intended Actions for 2024/2025**

What are your plans for 2024/25?	How are you going to action and achieve these plans?
Intent	Implementation
To continue improving the structure of play at lunchtimes.	Meet with play leaders and discuss ideas to move forward. Emphasise the need to look after equipment through assemblies. Use competitive activities to engage a different cohort and encourage team work.
To increase the activity time of all pupils throughout the week by using the daily mile.	Allow staff to choose when to run and allow flexibility with this. KS1 works better with a set time to run for, rather than distance.
To promote a healthy lifestyle and to closely monitor activity in relation to the 60 active minutes agenda.	Evaluate our extracurricular offer. Offer catch up swimming lessons to those who are below target and review activity levels each term.
To offer staff more support through learning walks and having the time to feedback on schemes.	Speak with the headteacher to see how this can be built into CPD.
To develop the outdoor education equipment and schemes of work to make them quicker in terms of set up.	PE lead to work on this during Autumn term.
Ensure the environment and equipment is fit for purpose.	Minibus and equipment to be serviced annually.

Lunchtimes should be active and purposeful with children having a choice about how to be active.	Play leaders role to develop into something younger children aspire to be.
The aerobic fitness of all children should increase with regular daily mile runs.	It might be noticeable that the intensity of activity in PE lessons increases as the aerobic fitness of classes improves.
Meeting the 60 active minute target should become the norm.	Record of lunchtime activities and after school clubs along with end of year questionnaires will evidence activity across the school.
More staff should enjoy teaching PE and high quality lessons should engage the children.	Learning walks and engagement in whole school active events will demonstrate whether children enjoy PE and the confidence of staff in delivery.
Outdoor education lessons become easier to implement.	Schemes are taught in their entirety.
