

English:

Talk For Writing:

This term, children will explore a variety of text types and themes to deepen their reading and writing skills. Our reading focus will include a range of poetry and Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief by Rick Riordan. Through these texts, children will develop their comprehension skills and explore a range of genres and writing styles.

In writing, the focus will be on creating action and suspense within stories. The children will also explore biographies, compose nature-inspired poetry, and explore playscripts through their end-of-year production.

In spelling, we will be focusing on learning and applying key spelling patterns and rules, as well as developing accuracy when spelling common words in their writing.

Music

Ukulele:

Children will learn the basic skills of playing a musical instrument, developing their confidence and technique.

The children will also be learning, practising and performing the songs for their exciting end-of-year production.

Computing

Micro: bits:

Children will explore how to program BBC micro: bit, creating interactive projects with sensors, variables and conditional statements.

Geography

Independent fieldwork enquiry:

Observing, measuring, recording and presenting their own fieldwork study of the local area.

History

Ancient Greeks:

The children will explore the city-states of Athens and Sparta to identify similarities and differences between them, learning about democracy and an exciting Greek day!

Personal, Social, Health Education Health and Well-being:

Energy- Light and reflection:

Children will explore how light travels in straight lines and that this explains observations of shadows and reflection.

Art and Design

Mixed Media:

This project teaches children about paper crafts, papermaking and collage techniques, including paper, fabric, mixed media and photo collage creating a final piece of small-scale, mixed media collage.

Expression:

Children will explore the Expressionist art movement and the 'Father of Expressionism', Edvard Munch. They explore ways to portray feelings and emotions in art to create an imaginative self-portrait.

Design Technology

Architecture:

This project teaches children about how architectural style and technology has developed over time and then use this knowledge to design a building with specific features.

Children will design and create their own props, using a range of materials and techniques to support and enhance the end-of-year performance.
